## Solomon Admires His Bride's Beauty

<sup>1</sup> He Behold, you are beautiful, my love, behold, you are beautiful! Your eyes are doves behind your veil. Your hair is like a flock of goats leaping down the slopes of Gilead. <sup>2</sup> Your teeth are like a flock of shorn ewes that have come up from the washing, all of which bear twins, and not one among them has lost its young. <sup>3</sup> Your lips are like a scarlet thread, and your mouth is lovely. Your cheeks are like halves of a pomegranate behind your veil. <sup>4</sup> Your neck is like the tower of David, built in rows of stone; on it hang a thousand shields, all of them shields of warriors. <sup>5</sup> Your two breasts are like two fawns, twins of a gazelle, that graze among the lilies.

<sup>6</sup> Until the day breathes and the shadows flee, I will go away to the mountain of myrrh and the hill of frankincense. <sup>7</sup> You are altogether beautiful, my love; there is no flaw in you.

<sup>8</sup> Come with me from Lebanon, my bride; come with me from Lebanon. Depart from the peak of Amana, from the peak of Senir and Hermon, from the dens of lions, from the mountains of leopards. <sup>9</sup> You have captivated my heart, my sister, my bride; you have captivated my heart with one glance of your eyes, with one jewel of your necklace.

<sup>10</sup> How beautiful is your love, my sister, my bride! How much better is your love than wine, and the fragrance of your oils than any spice! <sup>11</sup> Your lips drip nectar, my bride; honey and milk are under your tongue; the fragrance of your garments is like the fragrance of Lebanon.

<sup>12</sup> A garden locked is my sister, my bride, a spring locked, a fountain sealed. <sup>13</sup> Your shoots are an orchard of pomegranates with all choicest fruits, henna with nard, <sup>14</sup> nard and saffron, calamus and cinnamon, with all trees of frankincense, myrrh and aloes, with all choice spices— <sup>15</sup> a garden fountain, a well of living water, and flowing streams from Lebanon.
